Skanska Appoints Corporate Counsel, Accounting Director and Business Development Manager to Expanding San Antonio Team

San Antonio, Texas – Skanska USA today announced that its building business unit, which is a leading provider of construction management, preconstruction, and design-build services, has named Taylor Shultz as corporate counsel for its Midwest region, Mike Makris as director of project accounting for its Texas region and has promoted Josue Reyes to business development manager. Shultz, Makris and Reyes will all be based in Skanska's San Antonio office.

Providing legal support for Skanska's operations in Texas, Tennessee, and Michigan, Shultz will be responsible for contract drafting and negotiation, claims support and litigation management.

Shultz previsouly served as an associate attorney at Seyfarth Shaw LLP in Washington, D.C. for more than eight years where he focused his practice on commercial and government construction law.

Shultz received his Juris Doctorate from the University of Texas at Austin School of Law and his Bachelor of Arts degree from Washington and Lee University.

As director of project accounting, Makris will manage all aspects of project financial reporting, cash management and forecasting, staff training and support, construction work in process, risk management and corporate reporting.

Makris, who has been with the company for more than six years in the Southfield, Michigan, office, previously served as the director for project accounting for the Midwest region. He received his bachelor's degree in corporate finance from Wayne State University. He also began a master's in accounting program at Wayne State University prior to his move to San Antonio which he plans to complete soon.

Reyes will manage business development initiatives for San Antonio and the Rio Grande Valley and continue to help drive Skanska's sales and revenue in Texas, which have more than doubled in the past three years. Reyes, who has been with the company for three years and has 11 years of construction management experience, previously served as a senior project manager at Skanska's Harlingen office. While there he was responsible for onsite project management, including the recently opened Palmview High School in Mission, Texas, and the University of Brownsville and Texas Southmost College Arts Building in Brownsville, Texas.

Reyes earned a bachelor's degree in Construction Science from Texas A&M University.
