Skanska USA Hires Keith Sabol as Design Build Director, Project Manager for Civil Business Unit

New York, NY – Skanska USA, a leading provider of construction management, preconstruction, and design-build services, announced today that it has hired Keith Sabol, 51, as design build director and project manager for its Civil Business Unit, which delivers complex civil engineering construction and infrastructure projects. Sabol will be based in Skanska’s office in Queens, New York.

Sabol brings more than 28 years of experience to Skanska, and has built a reputation for successfully delivering complex transportation infrastructure projects, in the U.S. and Canada. For the past 20 years, he has focused on managing large, complex design-build projects, including public-private partnership projects.

In this newly created position at Skanska, Sabol will utilize his experience in design, management and marketing of transportation infrastructure projects to manage large-scale projects delivered through the design-build delivery method. He will report directly to Mike Viggiano, executive vice president for Skanska USA Civil Northeast, and also work closely with Mike Cobelli, chief operating officer for Skanska USA Civil.

“Keith’s strong background in civil engineering coupled with his vast experience and industry knowledge of the design-build delivery method make him an extremely valuable asset to us as we look to pursue more design-build projects,” said Cobelli. “He has played an integral role on many significant transportation projects throughout North America, including Skanska’s Midtown Tunnel public-private partnership project, and I look forward to the contributions he will bring to our growing team.”

Throughout his career, Sabol has managed numerous design-build projects. For example, he was a design manager for the reconstruction of Interstate 15 in Salt Lake City, Utah, led the design of the Tacoma Narrows (suspension) Bridge Project in Tacoma, Washington, was the design-build manager of Autoroute 25, the first public-private partnership in Montreal, Quebec, and is currently working on the Midtown Tunnel Project, a \$1.6 billion public-private partnership, which is a joint venture between Skanska and Macquarie.

Before joining Skanska, Sabol served as associate vice president and client service leader for HNTB Corporation.

Sabol graduated from Michigan Technological University with a Bachelor of Science degree in civil engineering and then went on to receive a Master of Science in management from North Carolina State University. Most recently, he attended the University of Pennsylvania’s Wharton School, Advanced Management Program.

As a member of the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT), and the American General Contractors (AGC) joint task force on design-build, Sabol is highly immersed in the design-build practices and delivery. He was also a key member of the team to develop a project risk assessment process adopted by the Federal Highway Administration for budgeting and funding large projects.

Skanska has completed numerous complex projects nationwide through the design-build construction method. For example, Skanska constructed The MetLife Stadium, home to the New York Giants and New York Jets stadium in East Rutherford, N.J., through the design-build method.

In addition, Skanska has employed the method on multiple transportation projects, including JFK International Airport's AirTrain for The Port Authority of New York & New Jersey, and the new Cooper River Bridge in South Carolina for the South Carolina Department of Transportation (SCDOT).

Skanska has recently expanded its design-build expertise to include work on public private partnerships (PPP), and is currently constructing the Downtown Tunnel/Midtown Tunnel/MLK Extension Project in Norfolk and Portsmouth, Virginia, through the design-build method. This project represents Skanska's first PPP in the United States.
