Jenkins Skanska Awarded \$59 Million Project at Detroit Medical Center

Detroit, Mich., February 17, 2012 – Jenkins Skanska, a 50/50 partnership between Jenkins Construction and Skanska USA Building, was recently awarded a \$59 million contract to provide construction management services for Detroit Medical Center's new Heart Hospital.

This 198,842-square-foot, six-story building, designed by Harley Ellis Devereaux, will support inpatient and outpatient services, including cardiovascular and surgery services, and include two floors of clinical offices. Once completed in the spring of 2014, it is expected to meet LEED® for Healthcare certification requirements.

"The Jenkins Skanska partnership brings together two strong companies to build this addition to Detroit Medical Center," said Jim Wright with Detroit Medical Center. "Their combined experience in health care construction, not only in Detroit, but throughout the country, will ensure that high-quality work will be done with minimal disturbances to our existing operations."

The project construction is expected to begin in March 2012 and will wrap up in the spring of 2014. The project is expected to employ at least 250 full-time construction workers and tradesmen during the next two years.
