## Skanska's Nashville Office Moves to LEED Building in Cool Springs

**NASHVILLE, Tenn., Oct. 29, 2012** – Skanska USA announced today that its Nashvillearea office has moved to the LEED certified 5000 Meridian Boulevard building in Cool Springs from its former Green Hills location.

The 11,000-square-foot office space has an open design with no individual offices. The open work spaces have access to natural light and the glass-walled conference areas and huddle rooms encourage creativity and collaboration among staff members. The location also offers local amenities including a hotel, restaurants and retail shops within walking distance to the office as well as single stream, onsite recycling capabilities.

"Our new office aligns with our overall commitment to sustainability and enables us to continue recycling and other green efforts," said Nashville Co-Chief Operating officer Joey Hatch. "Given the attractive location and the importance we put on being connected and involved in the surrounding region, we believe our new office will help us attract and retain top talent and be a positive force in the community.

As part of the move, the team took into account the potential waste from moving from a traditional space to an open, minimalist office design. Approximately 90 percent of materials not taken to the new office have been recycled or donated. For example, all paper, aluminum, cardboard, plastic waste, old plaques and trophies were recycled and all old furniture and appliances were donated to five local nonprofit organizations including St. Luke's Community House (Nashville); Safe Haven Family Shelter (Nashville); Nashville Business Incubation Center; East Robertson High School Football Team (Cross Plains); and Goodwill.

"Whether it's on our construction projects or in the office, we try to be thoughtful about our impact on the community and to take every possible measure to make it a positive one," said Joey Hatch. "We look forward to continuing to do great work for our clients while being part of such a thriving area of Franklin."
