Skanska Donates Labor and Materials to CPNJ's Horizon School

announced today that it attended the grand opening of the new pool at Cerebral Palsy of North Jersey's (CPNJ) Horizon School in Livingston, New Jersey. CPNJ offers

Superintendent Robert Boyle was responsible for managing the 1,500-square-foot addition, which includes two shower changing rooms, restrooms, storage for pool equipment and a pump room for the pool. "I am honored to have had the opportunity to work closely with Cerebral Palsy of North Jersey on this project. This was a special cause for an outstanding organization and neighbor, and I am proud that Skanska stepped up to the plate to put this pool in place for the children," said Boyle.

Skanska also added features that had been left out of the original plan due to cost.
