Local Skanska Office LEEDs the Way with Accreditations

Durham, N.C. – Skanska USA Building Inc. announced today that more than 10 of its Virginia team members are now LEED[®] Accredited Professionals (AP). More than 25 percent of Skanska's Virginia staff are LEED APs.

LEED APs are building-industry professionals who have demonstrated a thorough understanding of green building and the LEED Green Building Rating System[™]. The LEED AP credential indicates that the professional has acquired the knowledge and skills to facilitate the LEED certification process.

"With more than 10 LEED APs located on our Virginia projects, our employees can work hand-in-hand with the design team, the client and subcontractors to implement the LEED process smoothly, consistently and without additional personnel," said Skanska Environmental Manager Courtney Lorenz. "With that, we demonstrate our strong commitment to sustainability by providing clients and partners with skills that differentiate us from other large commercial construction companies."

LEED Professional Accreditation is a voluntary designation achieved by individuals who have passed the LEED Professional Accreditation exam. Though the process is voluntary, it is not a simple task. It typically takes an individual approximately 30 to 60 hours to study and train, depending on the individual's knowledge of construction, design and sustainability prior to committing.

"What was once a specialized field five years ago is now commonplace," said Lorenz. "As such, it's vital that we're able to differentiate ourselves from others in the industry and deliver a consistently high level of performance, not only within LEED, but beyond it as well."

Skanska's LEED Accredited Professionals are not pooled in a certain section of its organizational chart. LEED APs are spread out across the board, from the newest project engineer to more than half of its senior management team.

Of the many Skanska projects pursuing LEED Certification in Virginia, some include: The Institute for Critical Technologies & Applied Sciences and the Academic and Student Affairs building, both at Virginia Tech., as well as Virginia Commonwealth University's Medical Science Building III. Additionally, the new Carilion Clinic in Roanoke is pursuing LEED Silver certification.

Skanska is the first and only construction manager in the U.S. that is ISO 14001 certified – the international third-party certification for an environmental management system.
